Completion ceremony of "The Project for the Improvement of Equipment for Restoration and Conservation of Archaeological Artifacts for the Scientific-Research Center of the Historical and Cultural Heritage"

On July 22, the completion ceremony of a new recovery laboratory equipped with modern equipment took place within the framework of "The Project for the Improvement of Equipment for Restoration and Conservation of Archaeological Artifacts for the Scientific-Research Center of the Historical and Cultural Heritage" with the support of the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The Ceremony was attended by Mr. Masanori Fukushima, Ambassador of Japan to Armenia, Mr. Ara Khzmalyan, Deputy Minister of Education, Science, Culture and Sports, Mr. Yukihiko Ejiri, Resident Representative of JICA Georgia Office, Mr. Khachik Harutyunyan, director of the Scientific-Research Center of the Historical and Cultural Heritage and representatives from the organizations.

The Grant Agreement between JICA and the Government of Armenia for this project was signed on February 16, 2018. As a result, the laboratory was equipped with the latest generation of state-of-the-art equipment, which is unique in the field of restoration of archeological finds in Armenia.

During the Ceremony, warmly welcoming the participants, Mr. Ara Khzmalyan expressed his gratitude to the JICA and the Embassy of Japan in Armenia for the implementation of the program in Armenia. According to Mr. Ara Khzmalyan only the nation with an ancient history can thus appreciate the historical and cultural heritage of another ancient nation.

Ambassador Fukushima, in turn, congratulated all the participants on the successful completion of the project and expressed his sincere hope that this project will further enhance the goodwill and friendly relations that already exist between Armenia and Japan.
